Pursuant to notice of meeting duly given, the Landmarks Commission met in the City Council Chambers. Present: Chair Ryan Molen, Commissioners Michael Karpowicz, Kristy Piasecki, Linda Hervatin, Ron Ruzicka, and Planner I Lauren Hoerr. The meeting was called to order at 7:00 p.m.

- I. Approval of Minutes Motion to approve the June 12, 2024 meeting minutes as submitted by Comr. Kleckner, seconded by Comr. Piasecki, and unanimously approved.

III. Certificates of Appropriateness – New Business

a. Case #9-2024 711 S. Kirkwood Rd (Landmark # 93, Manor Grove) - Marshall Tucker of Lawrence Fabric and Metal Structures presented plans for adding a traditional style green canopy to the side of the main Manor Grove building. Mr. Tucker explained that the canopy would replace a faux balcony that was never used and was only for aesthetic purposes as there are no windows or door access to the balcony. The proposed canopy would be supported by the building wall on two sides and a single support post on the front left corner. The use of the area underneath the canopy is not entirely known but it was discussed that it is used as a waiting area for transportation or for workers when taking a break. The Commission noted the area is slightly visible from Kirkwood Rd. The fabric used will be a forest green and is a fire safe fabric. Mr. Marshall noted that the property uses fabric canopies in their courtyard area elsewhere on the property. The proposed awning will not extend past the building and Mr. Marshall clarified that the measurements shown on the site plan may be inaccurate but the drawings showing the dimensions are correct. Comr. Karpowicz made a motion to approve the plans as submitted. Comr. Piasecki seconded the motion and it passed unanimously.



Further Description of Important Features: This limestone Gothic Revival Church has a gently sloping gable roof and has a square two-story tower at the southwest corner with a metal steeple, which is painted a faded dark red. There are stone buttresses at each corner and going down the long sidewalls. The windows and doors are Gothic pointed arches and have stone label molds over them. Under the stone eaves are stone modillions or corbels.		41. Distance From and Frontage on Road: 70' by 130' 1" frontage
		8. Site Plan with North Arrow:
The front has three bays plus the tower on the southwest corner. The center bay contains the double board-and-batten front door protected by a one-story gable stone projection. There is a small Gothic window in the main gable above the front door.		
On either side of the church there are 4 bays of stained glass ware transept-like projections, north and south, one bay deep an projection has a metal roof; the south projection has a slate roof front on the south projection with a gable roof over it.		
Since the Unitarians purchased the building in 1960 they have hexagonal all-glass window on the back to form an apse. Outsi On the south side they have added a modern one-story brick a the back a grey stone two-story office addition with a saltbox roa glass enclosed corridor.	de this window is a landscaped fenced-in courtyard. nd glass Sunday school building with a flat roof. 43. History and Significance: A lay leader, H. I. Bodley, began the first Episcopal services in St. Louis County in his home in 1854. In 1859 a parish was organized and admitted to the Diocese of Missouri. In 1860 the church was built at a cost of \$12,000.	
A beautiful stained glass on the east side was presented by Mr. James S. Wilgus. A bell was presented by Mr. Hanna of Frankfort, Kentucky, and an organ by Mr. H. W. Leffingwell of Kirkwood, and a stone front by St. John's Church of St. Louis. The church operated without a minister until after the debt was paid off in 1864.	
In 1914, a fire caused considerable damage in the oldest section of the Church but it was restored as it had been.	
In 1960 a new church was built at 514 E. Argonne, and this building was sold to the Eliot Unitarian Chapel. A low modern brick Sunday school was added to the south side of the church in 1962. It was designed by Smith and Entzeroth Architects.	
44. Description of Environment and Outbuildings: The church stands on a corner lot with the commercial part of Kirkwood at the front on the west and a residential part of Kirkwood behind it to the east. The lot is attractively
