WORK SESSION MINUTES

A work session of the Kirkwood City Council was held on November 7, 2024, at 5:30 p.m. at Kirkwood City Hall, 139 S. Kirkwood Road, Kirkwood, Missouri. Present Mayor Gibbons, Council Members Jaksetic, Luetzow, McLean, Rheinnecker, Schaefer, and Zimmer. Also in attendance were Assistant Chief Administrative Officer David Weidler, City Clerk Laurie Asche, Police Chief Murphy, Public Services Director Chris Krueger, City Attorney John Hessel, and Communications Manager Jessica Winter.

APPROVAL OF THE OCTOBER 10, 2024 WORK SESSION MINUTES

Motion was made by Council Member Schaefer and seconded by Council Member Zimmer to approve the minutes of the October 17th Work Session minutes. The minutes were approved, with Mayor Gibbons and Council Member McLean abstaining.

BOARDS AND COMMISSION POLICIES

Mayor Gibbons discussed board and commission policies with the Council. Some boards or commissions have had attendance issues. Council Member Jaksetic stated that some boards or commissions are governed by State statute, and some are not and are governed solely by the Kirkwood Code of Ordinances. There should be a way to create consistency for all the boards and commissions not governed by State Statute. Council Member Jaksetic suggested creating a subcommittee to develop consistent policies for boards and commissions. A discussion took place.

Motion was made by Council Member Zimmer and seconded by Council Member Schaefer to create a subcommittee that will include Council Members Jaksetic, Luetzow, and McLean, as well as Assistant Chief Administrative Officer David Weidler, to develop policies for the boards and commissions. A discussion took place. The motion was unanimously approved.

DIGITAL SPEED SIGNS AND UPDATE ON CROSSWALK SAFETY SIGNS

Public Services Director Chris Krueger and Police Chief Murphy discussed digital speed signs and crosswalk safety with the council. Seven years ago, the Kirkwood Police Department purchased three digital signs. Two solar-powered signs are on South Geyer; the third was taken down. Each sign cost under \$5,000. A city-wide Speed limit study will be released soon. Forty locations have been identified as speeding locations. The Vision Zero Action Committee will report on pedestrian accidents yearly.

Some discussion took place as follows:

- A question was raised about the signs being more effective than a standard speed sign.
 - Yes, they are more effective.
- A question was raised about the life span of the signs.
- A question was raised about where the signs would be placed.
- A question was raised about placing signs on Big Bend Road.
- A question was asked about which locations should be prioritized among the forty locations
- A question was raised about when the speed study will be available.
- A suggestion was raised to have the Vision Zero Committee report pedestrian accidents every six instead of a yearly basis.

Mayor Gibbons provided positive feedback on the crosswalk safety sign at Essex and Clay.



Q1. Including yourself, how many people in your household are...



by percentage of respondents (excluding "not provided")




Q23. Which of the following best describes your current housing?




Top 3 Reasons Preventing People from Visiting Kirkwood Parks / Facilities


Q9a. How would you rate the overall quality of the programs or events in which your household has participated?


Top 3 Reasons Preventing People from Participating in Kirkwood's Programs


Top 3 Organizations Respondents Used for Recreation Activities


Top 3 Ways Residents Learn about Parks, Facilities, Programs, and Events


Top 3 Methods of Communication Respondents Would Prefer


Top 3 Responses for Perceived Benefits of Kirkwood's Parks and Recreation Services

Top 3 Responses for the Level of Support for Improvements




Q17. How important do you feel it is for the City of Kirkwood to provide high quality parks, recreation facilities and programs?

by percentage of respondents (excluding "not sure")







Top 4 Most Important Facilities/Amenities by Respondents







Based on Priority Investment Rating




Top 3 Programs/Activities Needed by Respondents

Top 4 Most Important Programs/Activities by Respondents



Top Priorities for Investment for Programs/Activities Based on Priority Investment Rating








Investment Priorities

Top Priorities for Investment for Facilities/Amenities Based on Importance-Satisfaction Rating



Q16. If you had \$100, how would you allocate the funds among the parks and recreation categories listed below?












Have you/your household participated in any recreation programs offered in your community during the past year?









Please rate the overall condition of all the recreation programs you/your households have visited over the past year.



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Executive Summary

Kirkwood, Missouri Parks and Recreation Needs Assessment Survey Executive Summary

Overview

ETC Institute administered a needs assessment survey for the City of Kirkwood, Missouri during the early months of 2024. The purpose of the survey was to help determine parks and recreation priorities for the community.

Methodology

ETC Institute mailed a survey packet to a random sample of households throughout the City of Kirkwood. Each survey packet contained a cover letter, a copy of the survey, and a postage-paid return envelope. Residents who received the survey were given the option of returning the survey by mail or completing it online.

After the surveys were mailed, ETC Institute followed up with residents to encourage participation. To prevent people who were not residents of Kirkwood from participating, everyone who completed the survey online was required to enter their home address prior to submitting their survey. ETC Institute then matched the addresses entered online with the addresses originally selected for the random sample. If the address from a survey completed online did not match one of the addresses selected for the sample, the online survey was not included in the final database for this report.

The survey aimed to collect a minimum of 400 completed responses from residents, and this target was surpassed with 499 completed surveys collected. The overall results for the sample of 499 residents have a precision of at least +/-4.4% at the 95% level of confidence.

The major findings of the survey are summarized in the following pages.

Parks/Facilities/Programs Use

Parks/Facilities Use: Based on the sum of top four choices, respondents selected the facilities that they visit most often. The most visited facilities were: Kirkwood Park (90%), aquatic center (46%), and Kirkwood Community Center (39%). They were also asked what barriers prevented them from visiting facilities more often. The common barriers were: lack of amenities we want to use (42%), not aware of parks' or facilities' location (32%), and use parks/facilities in other cities/county (21%).

Programs/Events Use: Fifty-nine percent (59%) responded that they have participated in a program/event in the past year. They gave ratings to these programs. 27% rated "excellent," 58% rated "good," 13% rated "fair," and 1% rated "poor." For those that said they have not participated in any programs/events in the past year, they selected reasons why. The common reasons were: old & outdated facilities (31%), I don't know what is offered (29%), and too busy/not interested (21%).

Outside Organization

Respondents selected the organizations that they used for recreation/sports activities in the past year. The common organizations were: City of Kirkwood (70%), private clubs (38%), and neighboring cities (34%).

Communication

Respondents selected all the ways they learn about the City's parks, recreation facilities, programs, and events. The common used resources were: recreation activity brochure (60%), word of mouth (57%), and city website (52%). Based on the sum of top three choices, the most common used resources were: recreation activity brochure (49%), emails (40%), and social media (40%).

Benefits, Importance, and Improvements to Parks and Recreation

Agreement: Respondents rated their level of agreement with the following statements concerning some potential benefits of the City's parks and recreation services. The most agreed statements were: contributes to a higher quality of life in Kirkwood (90%), preserves open space & protects the environment (87%), and makes Kirkwood a more desirable place to live (87%).

Importance: Respondents rated how important it is for the City to provide high quality parks, recreation facilities, and programs. 91% felt it was very important, 8% felt it was somewhat important, and 1% felt it was not important.

Support: Respondents rated their level of support for the following actions (listed in the survey) the City could take to improve the parks and recreation system. The most supported actions were: improve outdoor aquatic center (79%), update playgrounds (78%), and improve underutilized parks (65%). Based on the sum of top two choices, the most supported actions were: improve outdoor aquatic center (58%), update playgrounds (43%), and improve underutilized parks (32%).

Recreation Facilities/Amenities Needs and Priorities

Facility Needs: Respondents were asked to identify if their household had a need for 22 recreation facilities and amenities and to rate how well their needs for each were currently being met. Based on this analysis, ETC Institute was able to estimate the number of households in the community that had the greatest "unmet" need for various facilities.

The three facilities with the highest percentage of households that have an unmet need:

- 1. Walking paths in parks
- 2. Large community parks
- 3. Shade & trees

Facility Importance: In addition to assessing the needs for each facility, ETC Institute also assessed the importance that residents placed on each item. Based on the sum of respondents' top four choices, these were the four facilities that ranked most important to residents:


- 1. Community center
- 2. Multi-use hiking, biking, walking trails
- 3. Swimming pools
- 4. Large community parks

Priorities for Facility Investments: The **Priority Investment Rating (PIR)** was developed by ETC Institute to provide organizations with an objective tool for evaluating the priority that should be placed on recreation and parks investments. The Priority Investment Rating (PIR) equally weighs (1) the importance that residents place on facilities and (2) how many residents have unmet needs for the facilities. [Details regarding the methodology for this analysis are provided in Section 4 of this report.]

Based the Priority Investment Rating (PIR), the following facilities were rated as high priorities for investment:

- Community center (PIR=200)
- Swimming pools (PIR=155)
- Multi-use hiking, biking, walking trails (PIR=155)
- Walking paths in parks (PIR=119)
- Large community parks (PIR=102)

The chart in the next page shows the Priority Investment Rating for each of the 22 facilities assessed in the survey.



Recreation Programs/Activities Needs and Priorities

Programs Needs: Respondents were asked to identify if their household had a need for 27 recreation programs and to rate how well their needs for each were currently being met. Based on this analysis, ETC Institute was able to estimate the number of households in the community that had the greatest "unmet" need for various programs.

The three programs with the highest percentage of households that have an unmet need:

- 1. Adult fitness & wellness programs
- 2. Exercise classes
- 3. Performing arts events

Program Importance: In addition to assessing the needs for each program, ETC Institute also assessed the importance that residents placed on each item. Based on the sum of respondents' top four choices, these were the four facilities that ranked most important to residents:


- 1. Adult fitness & wellness programs
- 2. Performing arts events
- Exercise classes
- 4. Pickleball/tennis lessons & leagues

Priorities for Program Investments: The Priority Investment Rating (PIR) was developed by ETC Institute to provide organizations with an objective tool for evaluating the priority that should be placed on program investments. The Priority Investment Rating (PIR) equally weighs (1) the importance that residents place on facilities and (2) how many residents have unmet needs for the programs. [Details regarding the methodology for this analysis are provided in Section 4 of this report.]

Based the Priority Investment Rating (PIR), the following programs were rated as high priorities for investment:

- Adult fitness & wellness programs (PIR=200)
- Exercise classes (PIR=141)

The chart below shows the Priority Investment Rating for each of the 27 programs assessed in the survey.



Investment Priorities

Recommended Priorities. In order to help the City identify investment priorities, ETC Institute conducted an Importance-Satisfaction (I-S) analysis. This analysis examined the importance residents placed on each facility and the level of satisfaction with each facility. By identifying services of high importance and low satisfaction, the analysis identified which facilities will have the most impact on overall satisfaction with the parks and recreation facilities in the future. If the City wants to improve its overall satisfaction rating, the City should prioritize investments in facilities with the highest Importance Satisfaction (I-S) ratings. Details regarding the methodology for the analysis are provided in Section 5 of this report.

Overall Priorities for the Facilities by Major Category. This analysis reviewed the importance of and satisfaction with the facilities. This analysis was conducted to help set the overall priorities for the facilities. Based on the results of this analysis, the facilities that are recommended as the top priorities in order to raise the facilities' overall satisfaction rating are listed below:

- Kirkwood Community Center (I-S = 0.36)
- Aquatic Center (I-S = 0.16)
- Ice Arena (I-S = 0.08)

The table below shows the Importance-Satisfaction rating for the nineteen major categories of parks and recreation facilities that were rated.































































Priority Investment Rating

Priority Investment Rating (PIR)



Overview

The Priority Investment Rating (PIR) was developed by ETC Institute to provide governments with an objective tool for evaluating the priority that should be placed on parks and recreation investments. The Priority Investment Rating was developed by ETC Institute to identify the facilities/programs residents think should receive the highest priority for investment. The Priority Investment Rating reflects the importance residents place on items (sum of top 4 choices) and the unmet needs (needs that are only being met 50% or less) for each facility/program relative to the facility/program that rated the highest overall. Since decisions related to future investments should consider both the level of unmet need and the importance of facilities/programs, the PIR weights each of these components equally.

The PIR reflects the sum of the Unmet Needs Rating and the Importance Rating as shown in the equation below:

For example, suppose the Unmet Needs Rating for playgrounds is 26.5 (out of 100) and the Importance Rating for playgrounds is 52 (out of 100), the Priority Investment Rating for playgrounds would be 78.5 (out of 200).

How to Analyze the Charts:


- High Priority Areas are those with a PIR of at least 100. A rating of 100 or above generally
 indicates there is a relatively high level of unmet need and residents generally think it is
 important to fund improvements in these areas. Improvements in this area are likely to
 have a positive impact on the greatest number of households.
- Medium Priority Areas are those with a PIR of 50-99. A rating in this range generally
 indicates there is a medium to high level of unmet need or a significant percentage of
 residents generally think it is important to fund improvements in these areas.
- Low Priority Areas are those with a PIR below 50. A rating in this range generally
 indicates there is a relatively low level of unmet need and residents do not think it is
 important to fund improvements in these areas. Improvements may be warranted if the
 needs of very specialized populations are being targeted.






Top Priorities for Investment for Facilities/Amenities Based on Priority Investment Rating





I-S Analysis

Overview

Today, officials have limited resources which need to be targeted to facilities that are of the most benefit to their residents. Two of the most important criteria for decision making are (1) to target resources toward services of the highest importance to citizens; and (2) to target resources toward those facilities where citizens are the least satisfied.

The Importance-Satisfaction (IS) rating is a unique tool that allows public officials to better understand both of these highly important decision-making criteria for each of the facilities they are providing. The Importance-Satisfaction rating is based on the concept that public agencies will maximize overall customer satisfaction by emphasizing improvements in those areas where the level of satisfaction is relatively low, and the perceived importance of the service is relatively high.

Methodology

The rating is calculated by summing the percentage of responses for items selected as the first, second, and third most important services for the City to emphasize. The sum is then multiplied by 1 minus the percentage of respondents who indicated they were positively satisfied with the City's performance in the related area (the sum of the ratings of 4 and 5 on a 5-point scale excluding "Don't Know" responses). "Don't Know" responses are excluded from the calculation to ensure the satisfaction ratings among service categories are comparable. [IS=Importance x (1-Satisfaction)].

Example of the Calculation: Respondents were asked to identify the recreation facilities they think should receive the most emphasis from the City. Fifty-four percent (53.7%) of respondents selected *Kirkwood Community Center*, as one of the most important facilities for the City to emphasize.

With regard to satisfaction, 32.7% of respondents surveyed rated the City's overall performance in the *Kirkwood Community Center*, as a "4" or "5" on a 5-point scale (where "5" means "Very Satisfied") excluding "Don't Know" responses. The I-S rating for *Kirkwood Community Center*, was calculated by multiplying the sum of the most important percentages by 1 minus the sum of the satisfaction percentages. In this example 53.7% was multiplied by 32.7% (1-0.327). This calculation yielded an I-S rating of 0.13 which ranked third out of 19 parks and recreation facilities categories.

The maximum rating is 1.00 and would be achieved when 100% of the respondents select an item as one of their top three choices to emphasize over the next two years and 0% indicate they are positively satisfied with the delivery of the facility.

The lowest rating is 0.00 and could be achieved under either of the following two situations:

- If 100% of the respondents were positively satisfied with the delivery of the service
- If none (0%) of the respondents selected the service as one for the three most important areas for the County to emphasize over the next two years.

Interpreting the Ratings

Ratings that are greater than or equal to 0.20 identify areas that should receive significantly more emphasis over the next two years. Ratings from 0.10 to 0.20 identify service areas that should receive increased emphasis. Ratings less than 0.10 should continue to receive the current level of emphasis.

- Definitely Increase Emphasis (IS>=0.20)
- Increase Current Emphasis (0.10<=IS<0.20)
- Maintain Current Emphasis (IS<0.10)

City of Kirkwood Work Session November 14, 2024 Police and Fire Pension Tax

In preparation for the FY26 budgeting process we are presenting an update on the performance of the Police and Fire Property Tax. The City of Kirkwood receives a dedicated property tax to fund obligations to the City of Kirkwood's Police Officers' and Firefighters' Pension Plan. The initial intent of this tax was to fully cover the retirement expenses of the City's commissioned Police Officers and Firefighters. The City Council enacted a voluntary reduction to the tax rate. Over time expenses increased at a rate higher than that of the tax revenue. In 2016, the Fire Department increased their staffing from 46 to 54 full time employees, adding reoccurring expenses. This increase in staff was determined by City Council after the passage of a dedicated Fire Protection Sales Tax in 2015. In 2018, in order to help offset the increased expenses, City Council voted to remove the Police and Fire Property Tax voluntary rate reduction, increasing the tax rate to the permitted maximum. In FY2020 with a continuing deficit the City began to budget a transfer from the general fund to offset increased expenses. Attached is a schedule highlighting budget revenues and expenses for the Police and Fire Property Tax Pension Fund and the Fire Protection Sales Tax.

City of Kirkwood Work Session November 14, 2024 ARPA Funding Allocation

As you all are aware, the City of Kirkwood is a direct recipient of federal pandemic aid in the form of American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) funding. This funding has benefited the citizens of Kirkwood through various projects identified by City Council since ARPA distributions began in 2021. The US Treasury Department requires that all ARPA funds be allocated no later than December 31, 2024 and fully expended by December 31, 2026. Treasury requires that all valid allocations must be tethered to a contracted project by the end of this calendar year.

The City has so far committed through budgeting to the following projects: replacement of the City's Enterprise Resource Program (ERP), the renovation of the Community Center, and the rebuild of the City Hall parking lot. We have discussed using ARPA funds in the relocation of public works to facilitate a possible move of dispatch to the new public work location. Please see below the accounting of ARPA fund allocations as considered. The allocation schedule utilizes all ARPA funds distributed to the City, and meets US Treasury allocation requirements prior to the end of the year deadline. This proposed allocation serves the City's interests and needs. Official affirmation would be indicated by vote of Council at the work session.
